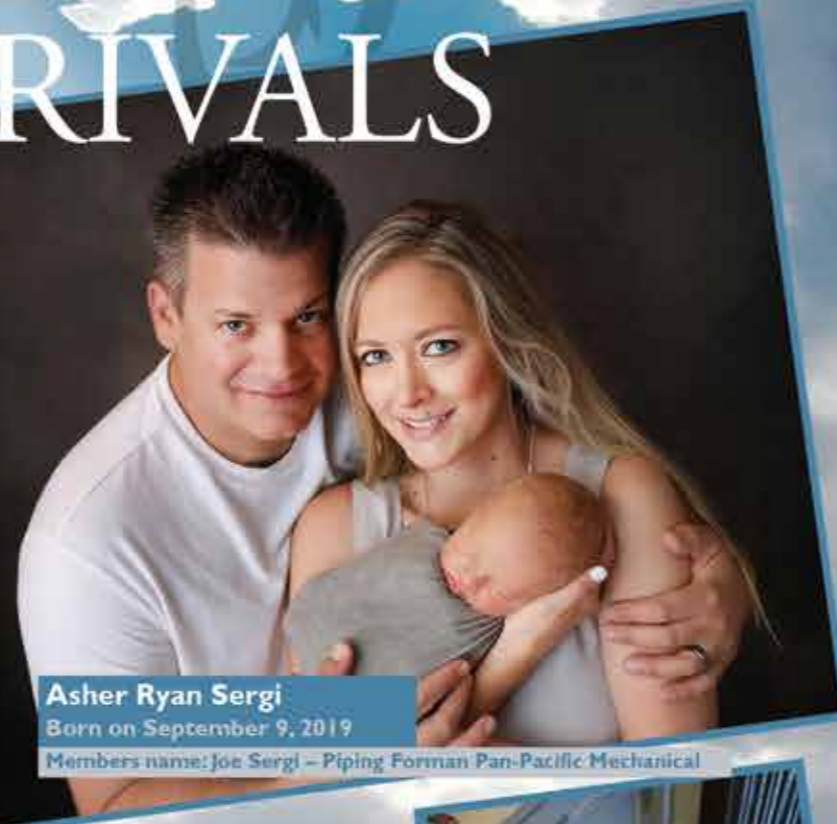

They are installing Lab Acid waste piping, RO-DI water piping, Medical Gases such as Lab Air and Lab Vacuum. As well as, Specialty Gases and Process Cold water piping. CMI- Critchfield Mechanical Inc. Currently has 9 Local 582 Pipe Fitter Journeymen and Apprentices working on this job site. They are installing 18" Chilled Water piping that will run at 100PSI and installing 6" High Temp Hot Water that will run at 395 degrees and run at 390 PSI and all welds are 100% X-Ray.

We would like to introduce our newest addition to the Local 582 Political Action team.

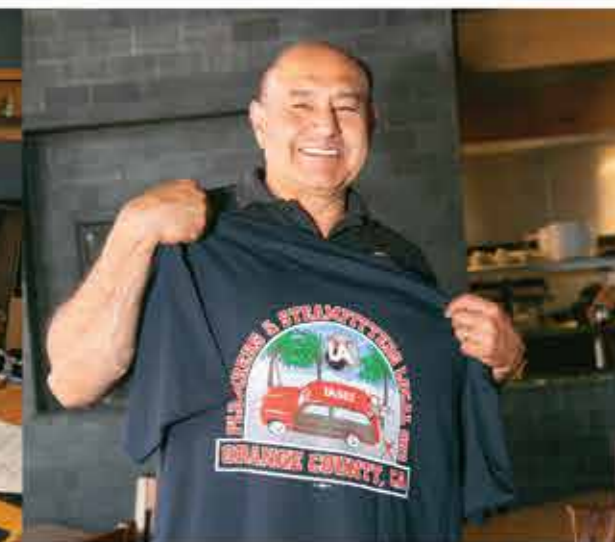
Luis Andres Perez
